# Ancient History Construction Project

Final Due Date: Monday, December 11, 2017

Here's your chance to learn about ancient history in a different way. You will choose one aspect of a culture that we are studying in this course and then research and design, create, or build a project that reflects your in-depth understanding of the subject of your choice. Your project will consist of two parts:

- 1. A hands-on project (a construction, creation, diorama, or display)
- 2. A five-paragraph report, with a bibliography/works cited page. The topic of the paper should be related to the subject of the project.

The project will be graded as follows: Be sure to follow the deadlines on the next page. You will lose 2 points per day for each deadline missed.

#### Research and Outline (25 points):

We will be using NoodleTools to create note cards, an outline, and citations.

Paper (50 points): (25 points for the rough draft/25 points for the final draft)

Subject of your choice Information is accurate Includes specific details to illustrate the subject Follows the guidelines for a formal essay

#### Bibliography (10 pts):

Must follow the Chicago Style format. Must include <u>at least THREE good sources</u>, and <u>at least one of them must be a book</u> other than your textbook.

#### No Wikipedia!

Your project will be graded on <u>creativity</u>, <u>attention to detail</u>, and <u>effort</u>. A strong project demonstrates in-depth knowledge of your subject/<u>historical accuracy</u>.

#### Suggestions:

- Make a display of different types of <u>stone tools used by prehistoric humans</u>, with models of different types of tools.
- Make a diorama or model of a <u>Mesopotamian city-state</u>, an <u>Egyptian tomb</u>, <u>Solomon's</u> <u>Temple</u>, a scene from the Hebrews' escape from Egypt, or some other scene from ancient history.
- Make papyrus (instructions on the internet using <u>real papyrus</u> or <u>newspaper</u>) and paint a scene of Egyptian <u>mythology</u> or daily life on it.
- Make a <u>physical map</u> of one of the civilizations, being sure to include major bodies of water, cities, rivers, mountains, forests, etc.
- Make models of some of the treasures found in Tutankhamen's tomb.
- Research and draw the <u>different hairstyles</u> and/or make-up that were used in ancient <u>Eqypt</u>, <u>Greece</u>, <u>Rome</u>, <u>India</u>, <u>China</u>, or Medieval Europe</u>.
- Make a model of pyramids of the African kingdom of Meroë.
- Make a model of a terracotta sculpture of the <u>African culture of Nok</u>.
- Research and make or draw clothing styles from one of the ancient cultures.
- Make or draw a <u>Phoenician ship</u> or a <u>Greek trireme</u> (ship), and carefully label each important section.
- Make an <u>oracle bone</u>.
- Make a model of a <u>standard</u> used by the Roman army.
- Make homemade paper and a display showing how the ancient <u>Chinese made paper</u>.
- Make a display of <u>Harappan seals</u>, made of clay.
- Make a mummy and explain the <u>embalming process</u>, step by step.
- Make a display of the <u>Assyrian army</u>, including weapons and methods of warfare.
- Make a display of <u>Chinese calligraphy</u>, showing how it is done, and doing some of your own.
- Create a display of one or more events of the ancient Greek Olympics.
- Create a model of a <u>Shang Dynasty bronze vase/vessel</u>.
- Create a model of one of the famous monuments of Ancient Babylon: the <u>Hanging Gardens</u> or the <u>Ishtar Gate</u>.

- Make a model of the <u>Minoan palace of Knossos</u> or a replica of one of the <u>Minoan frescoes</u> (wall paintings).
- Create a display of <u>ancient writing</u>, showing development of a system of writing over time. (<u>Phoenician</u> to <u>Greek</u> to <u>Roman</u> OR early <u>Chinese to modern Chinese</u>)
- Make a mosaic in any of the following styles: Greek, Roman, Byzantine, Islamic.
- Make a model of a <u>Greek vase</u>.
- Make a display of <u>ancient coins</u>. Draw them or make them from clay and paint them. Label each coin with a culture (or dynasty) and date. (Example: <u>Zhou Dynasty</u>, c. 700 BCE, <u>Roman Republic</u>, c. 100 BCE)
- Make a display, model or diorama of a Greek <u>hoplite phalanx</u> or of a <u>Roman legion</u> (army unit). Include labels describing how these soldiers fought.
- Make a display or model of <u>ancient inventions</u> or of one important invention. Label the display to explain how the invention(s) worked. (Examples: <u>Chinese seismograph</u>, <u>Archimedes' war machines</u>, , <u>steam engine of Hero of Alexandria</u>, <u>Chinese rocket-propelled</u> <u>fire arrows</u> or <u>repeating crossbows</u>,.)
- Create a display or models of musical instruments from one of the ancient or medieval cultures: <u>Greek</u>. <u>Roman</u>, <u>Chinese</u>, and <u>medieval European</u>.
- Build a <u>Roman fort</u> or <u>villa</u>, labeling the different rooms/sections.
- Build a <u>Roman aqueduct</u>, with an explanation of how it worked.
- Make a model of one of the soldiers in the <u>Terracotta Army</u> of the Chinese Emperor Qin Shi Huangdi.
- Make a model of a <u>Greek theater</u>.
- Create a model of an <u>African mosque</u> of the city of Timbuktu, Jenne, or Gao.
- Make a model of a <u>medieval castle</u> or <u>cathedral</u>.
- Make or draw a display of medieval stained glass.
- Create an <u>illuminated manuscript</u> (highly decorated book page—with the fancy first capital letter and illustration) in the medieval style.
- Make a display of <u>Islamic art</u> with beautiful <u>geometric patterns</u>, often with Arabic calligraphy.
- Make a <u>mosque</u> from early Islamic times.
- Create a diorama or display of a medieval tournament.
- You're welcome to come up with your own idea, but check with me **before** you begin your project.
